HOUSE ACCOUNT INFORMATION

Please remember that House Account statements are put on Tee-On weekly (and sometimes more often). If you do not know how to access your statements on Tee-On please come to the office or call either Nancy (ext 221) or Dana (ext 224) and we can help you. If you pay for your purchases as you make them you will not see them on your statement but you will be able to see what you have left to spend of your minimum. I ask that as you purchase items from the food and beverage area that you monitor your bills to ensure that your name appears on it. We have many new members this year and even though our servers are trying hard, they cannot know everyone. Please indicate your name clearly especially since we have many members with the same last name and check that it appears on the bill.

Every week any balance on your house account is charged to your credit card and applied to your house account. By looking at your statements on Tee-On you can match these payments against your credit card statement.

Please remember to let Nancy know if you have changed your card or have a new expiry date.

We do not mail your statement so if you do not use a computer please come to the office and we will be happy to print it off for you and answer any questions.
